

Site investigations in South Gippsland and the Latrobe Valley

From early 2026, we are undertaking surveys and investigations along the Marinus Link cable route in South Gippsland and the Latrobe Valley

What does it involve?

These investigations will occur on some properties and roads along the cable route between Waratah Bay and Hazelwood - see map over the page.

If any works are required on or change access to private property, we will liaise directly with impacted occupants in advance.

Activities will include:

- ◇ Site setup and local traffic management
- ◇ Land surveying
- ◇ Utilities locating
- ◇ Ecology and environmental assessments
- ◇ Cultural heritage investigations
- ◇ Geotechnical investigations.

What to expect

- ◇ **Whilst we conduct these works, there will be an increase in light and heavy vehicles in local areas.**
- ◇ **Works will be completed between the following working hours:**
 - » **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm**
 - » **Saturday, 7am to 1pm**



Background

Marinus Link is a new electricity and telecommunications interconnector between North West Tasmania and Victoria's Latrobe Valley.

It includes high-voltage and fibre-optic cables spanning 255 km across Bass Strait and 90 km underground in Gippsland, along with a communications station at Waratah Bay and converter stations at Heybridge and Hazelwood.

Marinus Link Pty Ltd is jointly owned by the Commonwealth, Tasmania and Victoria.
